The same seven species will continue for our 2011 Trophy Fish of the Year Program.

Blackfish
Bluefish
Fluke

The rules are simple: you have to catch a fish of the above species, take it to one of our official weigh stations to have it weighed and recorded on our official weigh-in forms. If you have weighed in the largest fish of a particular species for the calendar year 2011, then you win the FOY trophy for that species. Note: your dues have to be paid before you catch an eligible fish.

NEW JERSEY FLUKE SEASON TO START ON TIME

DEP Commissioner Responds to Public Requests and Legislative Appeal

Its official, New Jersey's summer flounder season will begin this Saturday, May 7.

The Recreational Fishing Alliance's New Jersey Chapter (RFA-NJ) chairman Capt. Adam Nowalsky was notified by the Bureau of Marine Fisheries that the summer flounder regulations recently approved by the Marine Fisheries Council were officially signed off on by Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) Commissioner Bob Martin this past Friday afternoon.

"We are happy the season will go forward as planned," said Capt. Nowalsky, who cited calls to the DEP office from public and letters of support from Congressman Frank Pallone and District 1 Legislators Sen. Jeff Van Drew, and Assemblymen Nelson Albano and Matt Milam as the reason for quick action by the Commissioner.

Nowalsky said an email blast sent out by the RFA-NJ last Thursday urging RFA members to help in an appeal to the DEP helped secure the season was opened on time. "The Bureau did their job getting the regulations to the DEP quickly, the public did their job getting involved, and the legislators did their job supporting their constituents."

Nowalsky said he hoped the DEP will act quickly on black sea bass measures that are to be decided on May 5. "It is good to know we have a strong support base at all levels to get things done if needed," said Nowalsky.

CHRISTIE ADMINISTRATION TO LAUNCH FREE WEB-BASED SALTWATER FISHING REGISTRY

(11/P62) TRENTON - The Christie Administration on Wednesday will launch the state's free web-based saltwater fishing registry, keeping recreational saltwater fishing in New Jersey a sport that anyone can enjoy without having to pay fees.

"This registry allows us to comply with a federal mandate to have a system in place to collect better

data from recreational anglers and better manage fishery resources that are so important to our economy, at the same time exempting our anglers from fees and keeping saltwater fishing in New Jersey free," said Department of Environmental Protection Commissioner Bob Martin.

Governor Christie signed legislation creating a free state saltwater registry on Feb. 22. Commissioner Martin signed an Administrative Order creating the registry.

The DEP's free, web-based saltwater fishing registry replaces a fee-based federal registry that New Jersey was required to participate in and which has been in effect since January. All saltwater anglers and for-hire vessel operators will now be able to register through the no-fee State system rather than the fee-based federal system.

Anglers still must register with the state system even if they have already registered with the federal system.

Those who fish from a for-hire party or charter fishing vessel that is registered with the New Jersey Saltwater Recreational Registry Program are not required to file for an individual registration.

Everyone 16 or older must register and carry the printed registration with them when fishing. People who fish for shellfish such as crabs, clams or lobster are not required to register, though existing license or permit requirements may be required depending on the gear used.

The National Marine Fisheries Service, the federal agency that manages national fisheries resources, will not refund the \$15 fee that New Jersey anglers have already paid by registering with that agency.

The DEP's Division of Fish and Wildlife has developed an entirely web-based registration system that anglers can use to register and print their registration, any time of day or night. This automated system will save significant implementation costs.

This web site is designed to allow a registrant to print a duplicate copy should the original registration be lost. The registry will be used to develop a database of anglers that the National Marine Fisheries Service will be able to contact in collecting information about the numbers and species of fish recreational anglers catch. The agency will use this information to

improve the quality of data used to make fisheries management decisions.

"I strongly encourage all anglers to take part in these surveys when contacted," Commissioner Martin said. "Their willing and honest participation will improve the science that is used to help protect the sport they enjoy so much, not only today but for future generations as well."

Upward of one million people fish in New Jersey's abundant and ecologically rich salt waters. Saltwater fishing provides 38,000 jobs and a \$1.2 billion annual boost to the state's economy, noted Commissioner Martin.

OFFSHORE FISHING ON THE “FINADDICT”

Many years ago, I had the privilege to fish offshore regularly with my good friend and neighbor Ed Cherry. Ed was the founder of the Village Harbour Fishing Club. Ed learned the offshore skills while keeping his boat at a marina in Northern NJ years earlier. A lot of it was trial and error but he also learned by sharing information and comparing notes with many of the Northern NJ masters that were located at the same marina. He continued those relationships after he moved to Manahawkin. Ed was an expert at offshore fishing.

Ed could smell out fish on the water. He could also return to the point of a strike with expert presentation. As a bonus, he was an early computer expert and knew how to track water temperatures and fishing reports on the computer. He almost always had a successful plan.

Ed had a new 25 foot Parker Sport Cabin with outriggers and extra rod holders. We would load extra gas and take it 30-60 miles off shore every weekend during the season. Some weekends we fished both Saturday and Sunday. We often brought home Yellow Fin and Dolphin/Dorado and occasionally a Wahoo. There is nothing like experiencing the colors of these fish while they are still fresh.

Ed taught me a lot and I got pretty good at rigging and managing the gear and landing and gaffing fish but, as you know, all bets are off when there are several fish on at once. My biggest problem was with the head room on the doorway to the cockpit. The head room was too low on these early model Parkers. Whenever there was panic on deck, I inevitably smacked my head on the top of the doorway as I entered or exited the cabin to adjust our steering.

On this particular day, we were into a school of Dorado. Ed and I were clearing some of the lines and I ran into the cockpit and just about knocked myself out on the doorway. I dizzily helped Ed to land a

couple fish but was cooked for the remainder of the trip.

That day, wouldn't you know it; the water was very snotty on the way in. Parker had overhead glass dome lights positioned over the captain and passenger seats. I already had a crushing headache with my run in with the doorway but, as we hit a big wave, I popped up out of the seat and the top of my head hit and crushed the glass dome light dropping glass all over me and the cockpit. Now, in addition to the headache, I was bleeding from my head.

When we got home we laughed about the experience but I took a pass on a Sunday follow up trip. Ed got a new dome glass and moved the fixture over so I wouldn't have any more accidents. I think the new Parker models have been redesigned to increase the height of the cabin door and the location of the lights.

I enjoyed my offshore fishing adventures on “Finaddict” with Ed, except for this one.

Topic...Striper trolling with bunker spoons and wreck fishing for blackfish

BAKED BLACK SEA BASS WITH SPINACH by Bill Dabney

Yield 4 servings

4 TBSP unsalted butter, cut into small pieces

1 ½ TBSP softened butter, for brushing

1 5 ounce bag spinach

Salt & ground pepper to taste

1 shallot, minced

4 8 ounce skinless sea bass filets

¼ cup white wine, use a New Zealand Sauvignon

Blanc wine for the recipe and finish the bottle with the meal

1. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Tear off four 18 inch lengths of foil. Generously brush the softened butter over an 8 inch square in the center of each foil sheet.
2. Mound the spinach in the center of the sheets and season with salt & pepper. Sprinkle with the shallot.
3. Season both sides of each sea bass fillet with salt & pepper and set the fillets on the spinach. Scatter the pieces of butter over the fish. Pull the sides of the foil up around the fish and drizzle the fillets with wine. Fold the edges of the foil to make sealed packets.
4. Arrange the packets on a baking sheet and bake for about 12 minutes, or until the fish is cooked through.
5. Transfer 1 of the packets to a medium bowl. Carefully make a small tear in the side of the packet and pour the juices into the bowl. Repeat with the 3 remaining packets.
6. Using a spatula, transfer the fish & spinach to shallow soup plates, pour the juices over the fish and serve.
